****IMPORTANT.****

Due to the limited entry being only 10 runs in each round (only 10 cars are permitted), we will be prioritising competitor entries who are entering 3+ rounds.

For the first 72 hours (3 days), please only register if you plan to enter 3 or more rounds of B stream and/or FEO runs.

After the 72 hours any remaining spots may be entered for any number of rounds in any combination of B stream, C stream, or FEO.

If at all possible we highly recommend car pooling to the event.

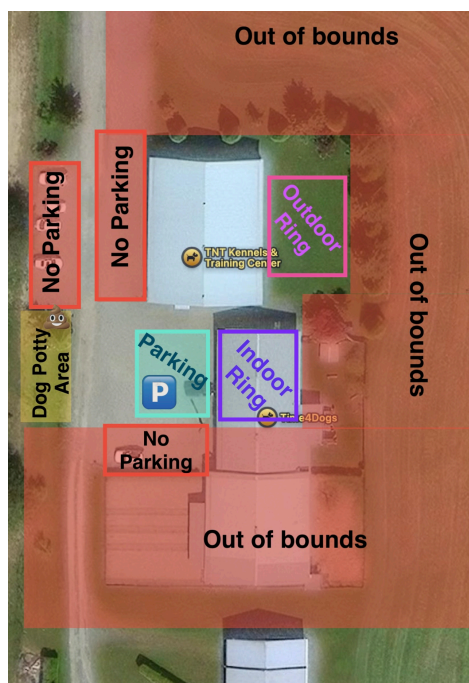

Facility Information:

- No indoor Crating available.
- You may crate out of vehicles.
- Free Parking is available but there are only 10 parking spots available on site.
 - Please ONLY park on the west side of the Billy building, from the north end of the building to the wood post by the training room door.
 - DO NOT park in front of if the daycare entrance or block the driveway.
 - We strongly encourage car pooling, if possible.
- All dogs must be kept in a vehicle, crated, or **on leash** when not in the ring. **ABSOLUTELY NO DOGS OFF LEASH** anywhere on the property, unless in the ring during your run.
- Please DO NOT walk your dogs on the large field. The owner has asked that no one be on that field unless they have rented it.
- Please only use the grass along the fence line to potty dogs.
- There is a flushing washroom inside, but that will not be available during runs - only between runs. There is a portable toilet outside if needed during runs.
- Please bring your own water bottle and snacks, if you wish.
- There is fast food options available about 20 minutes away and Food Delivery is also possible to our location.
- Human spectators and guests are welcome! No spectator dogs please.

Refunds

There shall be no refund for entries withdrawn or canceled after the closing date, or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal.

If your dog is unable to compete due to a medical condition, we will issue a refund upon receipt of proof from your veterinarian.

Closing Date for refunds is June 13, 2025

Dismissals

The Organisers and Judges reserve the right to dismiss any competitor, or dog, from competition, with no refund, for any of these reasons: failure to follow the CARO Code of Ethics, failure to clean up after your dog; aggression shown by any dog or human, towards any other dog or human; offensive physical or verbal corrections towards a dog; offensive physical or verbal abuse towards a human. Any person in breach of these guidelines, or who is subjecting the Judge or members of the organising committee to abuse, whether that person is competing in the trial or not. Competitors, you are responsible for your guests and ensuring they understand trial etiquette.

General CARO RallyO Competitor Information

This is a titling event under CARO rules and regulations. CARO encourages participation by all dogs – purebred or mixed breed, pets or titled champions – who are at least 6 months of age. (Except for bitches in season or dogs with injuries or illnesses which may cause the dog pain or discomfort, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression that threaten the safety of other dogs or humans.)

An officiating Judge and/or the Chairperson of the trial may dismiss from the trial site any person in breach of these guidelines or who is subjecting the Judge or members of the organizing committee to abuse, whether that person is competing in the trial or not.

Rewards (Novice and Advanced B stream): Upon successful completion of a “reward” station, the owner may choose to briefly pet or touch the dog as a reward. The owner may also choose to give the dog food as a reward. Food must be carried in the handler’s right-sided pocket and can only be present in the handler’s hand between exercises. Food may not be used as a lure to help the dog complete an exercise. No treat bags or toys are allowed in the ring. Any petting, touching, or feeding that significantly interrupts the flow of performance shall be scored accordingly.

Handlers with physical limitations: are encouraged to compete. If course or judging modifications are needed, the handler should provide the judge with a written description of what modifications they need, citing specific signs when possible, along with their entry form. The judge must approve and initial the modifications ahead of time.

Dogs with physical limitations: are allowed and encouraged to compete. The dogs must not show evidence of being in pain or discomfort. The judge shall excuse any dog that does so. If the dog has visible lameness or injury but has been cleared by a vet to compete, competitors will need to provide a vet note for the judge to review before competing. If course or judging modifications are needed, the handler should provide the judge with a written description of what modifications they need, citing specific signs, along with their entry form. The judge must approve and initial the modifications ahead of time.

Veteran Dogs: Are dogs that are over 7 years of age. They may select a lower jump height without a modification request. An official modification request must be made for any additional accommodations.

Sick dogs: If your dog is sick, please respect the other dogs and DO NOT attend the trial and seek veterinary attention. We will offer a refund with a veterinary note, however, we will NOT offer a refund to any dogs we need to dismiss from the trial site due to illness.

Bitches in season: are not permitted to compete. If a bitch comes into season after the entry is submitted, the Trial secretary must be notified before the date of the Trial. Whereupon the dog will be pulled and the entry fees will be refunded.

Safety: shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times. Handlers, through entry at this event, accept full responsibility for themselves and the actions of their dogs. Dogs must remain under control at all times and penned or on-leash while on show grounds.

You MUST pick up after yourself and your dog. Anyone found not picking up after themselves or their dog will be excused from the trial without a refund.

Collars, Leashes, and Harnesses: **ONLY** a flat buckle, snap collar or a fixed harness with no embellishments such as jewels, studs, or hanging attachments (such as tags) and a leash are approved equipment.

- Collars may be removed with the leash at all levels not requiring a leash.
- Leashes - should be long enough to provide adequate slack. Hands free leashes are acceptable. When a fixed harness is used, the leash must be attached to the back.
- Not permitted in the ring: Muzzles, martingale collars, choke collars, prong collars, shock collars, bandanas, martingale leads, head halters, moving harnesses or any harnesses that are designed to be correctional.
- Not permitted on trial grounds: Extendable leashes, slip leashes, prong, shock, and choke collars.

Awards: There will be qualifying ribbons awarded to each dog who achieved a qualifying score. Titling rosettes and "Perfect 200" rosettes will also be offered after judging the entire round.

Dog ID: Dogs are required to have a CARO registration number to compete and earn a qualifying score. If you do not have a CARO number for your dog when you complete this form put "pending" for your number and fill out the CARO registration form through CARO's website. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they have a CARO dog ID number before the day of the trial.

STREAM: B or C:

B Stream (Base stream) is for dogs that have not yet earned the basic title for the level in which they are competing.

C Stream (Championship stream) is for dogs who have already earned the base title for the level in which they are competing. C Stream qualifying scores are used for titles such as Bronze, Silver, Gold, Master Champion, Supreme Championship and Grand Master Champion.

C Stream qualifying scores are earned in the Advanced through Versatility Excellent levels. Dogs must have achieved the base title for a level before being eligible to begin earning C Stream qualifying scores in that level. Dogs may compete and earn qualifying scores in consecutive levels at the same trial if the dog completes the title in the lower level prior to the end of the trial. Should the title for the lower level not be earned, the runs completed at the higher level will be marked as invalid on the dog's record.
